Rangi Ruru

Kaupapa for Learning:

Manaakitanga—Hospitality, kindness, generosity, support—the process, action and emotion involved in showing respect, generosity and care for others.

Whakamana—Empowerment of learning through uninterrupted opportunities, development of own interests and meaningful, attainable and appropriate experiences.

Ako—A teaching and learning relationship, where Kaiako (teachers) are also learning from the children's interests and knowledge.

Whanaungatanga—relationship, kinship, sense of family connection—a relationship through shared experiences and working together which provides people with a sense of belonging.

Tuakana Teina—Relationship between an older (Tuakana) person and a younger (Teina) person and is specific to teaching and learning in the Maori context.

Kotahitanga—Unity, togetherness, solidarity, collective action.

Kaitiakitanga—Guardianship—an appreciation, awareness, love and respect for our natural world.
